Introduction

The installation has been created by Rebecca Churchill, Artist at Larkrise School. We are delighted that for this installation artworks have also been made and contributed by a variety of young artists across the region, through workshops with artists and musicians. The Roche Court Educational Trust, an arts education charity based at the New Art Centre Sculpture Park and Gallery in Wiltshire, is the creative partner on the project.

'Entertainment' art installation, has been inspired by a variety of sculptures exhibited at the New Art Centre Sculpture Park. Artists of inspiration have included Eva Rothschild, Des Hughes and Jim Lambie.

The project is designed to bring modern and contemporary art to those who are least likely to access it. We encourage all who encounter the installation to explore, experience and imagine art through all the senses.

Art to entertain all the Senses

The word 'Entertainment' and its associated activity is often linked with play and make believe. We have used this definition as the basis of our selection, choosing artists who inspire thought processes or responses of playing or make believe. As a viewer when you look at these sculptures you may be transported to situations in which you are entertained, presented with objects that invite interaction or consider abstract shapes and forms that transport you to a fantastical world- overall 'entertaining' our senses.
